PROCLAMATION OF A PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, in December 2019, a novel strain of the coronavirus now named Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) was detected and has spread throughout many countries, including the United States; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization has declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern; and the United States Department of Health and Human Services has declared a Public Health Emergency; and the Governor of the State of Wisconsin has declared a public health emergency, as defined in Section 323.02(16); and

WHEREAS, the existence of confirmed cases of COVID-19 within Wisconsin, constitutes a condition within the City posing an imminent threat of disaster within the meaning of Chapter 323 of the Wisconsin Statutes that could impair medical care, health protection, and other critical systems of Outagamie County; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kaukauna is responsible for the well-being of the public it serves and its employees and must undertake efforts to prevent the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the emergency could cause the City to expend, commit and exhaust all of its available resources; and could request state assistance and advises the State of Wisconsin of our emergency conditions; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED, by the Mayor, that a local public health emergency, as defined in Section 323.02(16) of the Wisconsin Statutes, now exists for the City of Kaukauna and shall remain in effect for 60 days unless by proclamation otherwise; and

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 323, as Mayor of the City of Kaukauna, in testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and have caused the great seal of the City of Kaukauna to be affixed.
