



KAUKAUNA VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK ASSOCIATION MINUTES OF OCTOBER 15, 2020

Council Chambers – Kaukauna Municipal Services Building

4:00 p.m.

A meeting of the Kaukauna Veterans Memorial Park Association was called to order by President Mayor Tony Penterman at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 15, 2020.

Present: Mayor Penterman, Fred Cazzola, Bob Kelly, Marty DeCoster, Lisa Wolfinger, Mark Landreman, Brian Roebke, Karen Koch and Brenda Leon joined via phone.

Absent: Gene Schaefer, Kennedy Coffee, Katie Harris

Bob Kelly requested an amendment to the minutes from October 10, 2019, to correct the spelling of his name. A motion was made by Brenda Leon, seconded by Marty DeCoster, to approve the amended minutes. All members voted aye, motion carried.

Fred noticed during the summer that a sidewalk block had raised over the winter and could be a potential trip hazard. Fred discussed the issue with City staff and the block was replaced. He commended the departments involved.

Fred also discussed sealing the bricks with Pat Vandenheuvel, Street Superintendent. Pat reached out to Weyers and was quoted \$1,500 and approximately two days of labor. The bricks would be pulled, cleaned, resealed and the sand would be replaced with new sand. Pat thought it would be best to have the work hired out versus having the Street Department doing it. The price isn't out of line, and then the bricks would be good for approximately another 10 years. Spring 2021 would be the best time to have the work done. Fred requested an update to the group on the decision after it has been made. Fred also mentioned one of the red triangles was chipped and should be sealed.

The flags are being changed out every six months. Gary Wolf and Karen are still looking into having a custom 4'x6' flag made for the National Guard. The ratio of pole size to flags was discussed.

Mayor mentioned that the VFW and American Legion have been holding funerals at the Ring of Honor, as well as other locations.

The Veteran's Day ceremony will be held at the Ring of Honor on November 11, 2020, at 11:00 a.m. The ceremony will be shorter than in previous years.

Mayor mentioned that at the next Board of Public Works meeting, the Civic Engagement Class will be making a presentation and asking for permission to place banners in the City for deceased Veterans. They are proposing approximately 91 banners.

There being no further business to be brought before the Association, a motion to adjourn was made by Bob Kelly, seconded by Fred Cazzola. All members voted aye, motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 4:23 p.m.
