## **SUMMER HOURS**

Municipal Services Building and SPaR office hours from May 30 - September 4, 2024 will be as follows:

# LARGE/IRREGULAR GARBAGE PICK-UP

Large/irregular garbage pick-up is collected during the second full week of the months of April - October.

Not more than five (5) large and irregular items may be placed by a residential property. Each individual piece of furniture, other items not in your cart, or 30-gallon containers that weigh no more than 50 pounds with material not more than 48" tall/long, count as one (1) item each. White goods must have pre-paid stickers from the Street Department and *do not* count as one of your 5 items. Questions can be directed to the Street Department 920.766.6337.

### TIRE COLLECTION

The City of Kaukauna will be conducting spring tire collection the week of **April 8-11, 2024** on your normal garbage collection day.

Kaukauna Street Department will collect of maximum of four (4) tires from residential customers only, rims must be removed. Tires still mounted on rims will not be picked up.

#### WHITE GOODS POLICY

All major appliances must have a sticker before being placed out for collection. Stickers can be purchased at the Street, Park, and Recreation (SPaR) office at 207 Reaume Avenue.

- Refrigerant stickers (refrigerator, freezer, air conditioner and dehumidifier) are \$15.00.
- Non-refrigerant stickers (washer, dryer, stove, oven, dishwasher, microwave, furnace, and water heater) are \$10.00.

# SPRING CLEANING FIRE SAFETY TIPS

#### Inside the home:

- Test all home smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.
  - Remember to change the batteries once a year.
  - Replace any detector greater than ten years old.
  - Clean any dust or debris from around the detector.
- Clean debris from clothes dryer lint trap and clean all exhaust ducts.
  - All vent pipes should be cleaned at least once per year as lint buildup can start a fire. Consider hiring a professional if this is beyond your comfort level.
  - Remove any combustibles from around the dryer, such as boxes or cleaning supplies.
- Review or implement a home escape plan.
  - Draw a floor plan with TWO ways out of each room. Make sure an emergency meeting place is also a part of your plan.
  - Make sure each person in the house is aware of the plan and has an accessible escape route.
  - Do a couple practice runs of the plan.

#### **Outside the home:**

- · Inspect and clean your grill.
  - o Clean and remove any grease, fat, or rust buildup from the winter.
  - Inspect any gas/propane connections or hoses are in good condition and have no leaks.
  - Make sure your grill is in an open area away from combustibles and at least 10 feet away from your house. According to NFPA, grill fires cause nearly 9,000 home fires every year.
- Remove dead leaves and other yard waste from around your foundation, decks, porches, and stairs.
  - Spring is an especially dry time of year in Wisconsin, a small spark can start a brush fire and spread quickly.
  - If you plan to burn your brush, a burn permit is required and can be obtained at the Kaukauna fire station.
- Properly use and store gasoline.
  - Only store gasoline in approved gas containers that are sold for that purpose. Never bring gasoline inside the house, even in small amounts.
  - Never store gasoline containers in a basement or other living space. Keep them in detached garages or outdoor sheds.

### **BRUSH ORDINANCE**

Brush collection is during the second full week of the months of April - October.

- Must be a minimum of 2' and a maximum of 6' in length. Brush 2'-4' in length must be bundled and secured with twine or string.
- Bundles and/or branches shall not exceed 50 pounds in weight.
   Bundles shall not be greater that 15" in diameter. Side branches on limbs shall be removed.
- Must be placed at the curb or alley line no more than 24 hours prior to the time of collection.
   Maximum pile height shall not exceed 4'. Butt ends shall face the roadway.
- Roots shall be removed from brush.
- Brush shall only be placed for collection by the owner or occupant who performed the brush removal, not by any contractor performing such work. Contractor is responsible for removal of any brush created by his/her work.
- Brush placed for collection in violation of these requirements will not be collected.

# DISPOSAL SITE CARD RENEWAL

Online renewal is available to City of Kaukauna residents who have previously purchased a Disposal Site card. **New card purchases must be done at the SPaR office located at 207 Reaume Avenue.** 

To renew your Disposal Site Card online, please follow these steps:

Click <u>here</u> to go to the Disposal Site Renewal page.

Select the black shopping basket icon to add to your cart.



- When prompted, log in to your Recreation Department account or click "Forgot Password?" and follow the prompts to receive a password.
- Select "Checkout" in the upper right corner of your desktop screen. (If using mobile, select the three lines in the upper left and then select "Checkout.")
- Patrons must enter the 5-digit number located on the front of the existing card to complete transaction.
  - Card style #1 XXX XXXXX XXXXXX
- Expiration date will be 365 days from the original expiration date.
   Cards renewed after the original expiration date will be active 365 days from date of renewal.

\*\*\*Please Note - Card activation for online renewal purchase may take up to two weeks from date of purchase. If the card has not reached its original expiration date yet, it is still active.

## **SPRING CLEAN-UP**

Week #1 - April 22-25, 2024 Week #2 - May 20-23, 2024

Leaves, garden debris, small sticks, and twigs MUST be in a Yard Master or equal 2-ply Kraft paper compost bag that are designed for yard waste disposal. These bags can be purchased at local hardware and grocery stores. Additionally, residents can use open containers with handles, no larger than 30 gallons, and not weighing more than 50 pounds. Plastic bags, grocery bags, and cardboard boxes containing yard waste will not be collected.

# HOMEOWNERS USING HEAVY EQUIPMENT

Any homeowners planning a constructon project within the City limits should be advised of the following City policies:

- Any contractor doing new or replacement work is required to remove and dispose of all construction debris at their expense. This includes tree removal and trimming.
- A homeowner using heavy equipment (backhoe, high lift, tractor, skid steer, etc.) is considered a contractor. Therefore, they are responsible for debris removal. The City will not pick up this debris.

# MOVE BEYOND NO MOW MAY

Pollinators, including bees, butterflies, birds, bats, and other small mammals, are responsible for 1 of every 3 bites of food you eat. Without these pollinators, our food systems as well as our natural ecosystems are in trouble. Although more research needs to be done to fully understand the decline of pollinator populations including the causes and effects, it is important to take action now to better support our pollinators.

# TIPS FOR HEALTHY LAWNS AND WATERS

ARE YOU TIRED OF GREEN PONDS, RIVERS AND LAKES IN WISCONSIN? HERE ARE SOME TIPS FOR HEALTHY LAWNS AND WATERS

- When you mow your yard, please do not mow the grass clippings into the street or gutter. Please take a little extra time to clean up property after you mow.
- Grass clippings in the street are being washed down the storm sewers and will end up in area lakes and rivers where they help produce algae blooms.
- Grass clippings contain phosphorus, the nutrient that turns lakes green with algae. Grass clippings from actively growing lawns have four to five times more phosphorus content than fallen autumn tree leaves.
- One bushel of fresh grass clippings can contain 0.1 lbs of phosphorus—enough to produce 30 to 50 pounds of algae growth as it finds its way to a pond, lake, or river.
- When mowing, grass clippings should be directed away from the street, driveways, sidewalks, or other paved areas and waters.
   Curbside storm sewers can transport grass clippings (along with other street debris and dirt) to nearby lakes, rivers, and wetlands.
