



FIREWORKS STAND REGULATIONS

The following requirements must be met covering the possession, manufacture, storage, handling, sale and use of explosive materials and fireworks in the City of Kaukauna. Further more, a permit will be required to possess, manufacture, store, handle or sell explosive materials or fireworks permitted within state statute 167.10 (1) (e), (f), (g), (i), (j), (k), (l), (m) and (n). **All other fireworks are prohibited within the City limits of Kaukauna.**

1. A minimum of a **2A10BC fire extinguisher** must be at the stand and all workers shall be familiar with operation of extinguisher. The extinguisher must be in a conspicuous location and have signage distinguishing its location.
2. FIREWORKS – NO SMOKING signs in letters at least 2 in. (51 mm) high on a contrasting background must be posted inside and outside of stand. No smoking, open flames, matches and spark producing devices shall be allowed within 25 feet of display.
3. Every wholesaler, dealer or jobber keeping, storing or handling fireworks of any description within the City of Kaukauna, shall notify the Kaukauna Fire Department Duty Officer immediately upon receipt of such fireworks or the removal thereof from one location to another, and shall indicate the location where such fireworks are stored and or sold. No fireworks shall be stored in any building used for dwelling purposes, or in any building situated within 50 feet of any building used for dwelling purposes or within 50 feet of any gasoline filling station.
4. Storage buildings shall conform to **NFPA 1124 & NFPA 495**.
5. The permit to sell fireworks shall be posted at the stand, in a conspicuous place.
6. Only those fireworks allowed in chapter 167, Wisconsin Statutes may be sold, possessed, or used in the City of Kaukauna by private individuals or organizations. Any such device that contains more than 1/4 grain of explosive powder, that emits a report, discharges a flame, or leaves the ground is not permitted to be sold, possessed, or used in the City of Kaukauna.
7. The Mayor may authorize the possession and use of fireworks and pyrotechnic devices that may otherwise be prohibited, for official public displays with recommendation from the fire chief.
8. All of Wisconsin State Statute 167 regarding Regulation of Fireworks (167.10), The 2006 IFC as well as the NFPA may be referenced to assure code compliance.
