LIONS & LIONESS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

The City of Kaukauna believes that all citizens should have the opportunity to participate in Recreation Department sponsored programs regardless of financial status. The Recreation Department has partnered with the Kaukauna Lions and Lioness Clubs to offer financial assistance to those in need.

- Eligibility: This program is for children ages 16 and under, whose primary residence is in the City of Kaukauna. Family household income must be below this year's US Department of Health and Human Services Poverty Guideline for the number of family members in the household. The Poverty Guidelines can be found on the HHS website at:http://www.hhs.gov. Eligibility will be determined on a case-by-case basis by the Recreation Department.
- Limitations: A limited amount of donated funds are available each year.
 Assistance is limited to \$25.00/individual and/or \$25.00/family. During spring and summer an additional \$25.00 may be awarded for a pool pass only.
- Application: Applications must be submitted to the Recreation Department Office at least two weeks prior to the program deadline or program start whichever comes earlier.

REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION POLICY

Due to the high volume of registrations, we do not send out confirmation of registration. We will only contact you in the case of a problem (cancellation, payment inaccuracy, program is full, etc.) You are welcome to call to confirm your registration.

We also welcome your suggestions for new programs and will research the feasibility of offering a related program.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- 1. Confirmation of Registration: Individuals registering online and mail-in registrations that provide an email address will receive confirmation via email, generated as soon as your registration is processed into the system. If you do not provide an email address and would like a receipt, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope with your registration.
- 2. **Changes:** All fees, dates & times for programs and charges for facilities are subject to change.
- 3. **Age Requirements:** All participants must meet the minimum age requirement prior to or on the first day of class. The ages are set to ensure the safety and benefit of the participant as well as the program instructors.
- 4. **Program Deadlines:** Unless advertised, all program deadlines are one week prior to the start of the program. The deadline is used to determine if the class will run or be cancelled. Registration is permitted after the deadline, provided there is room in the class/program.
- 5. Wait List: If a class is full, you may register to the wait list. When a spot becomes available, you will receive an automated offer to enroll for the class by email. You will be given 24 hours to contact the KRD office (920-766-6335), to accept the offer to enroll or decline the offer.
- 6. Program Cancellations: Please register early! Programs will be cancelled due to insufficient registrations. Notification of cancellations or schedule changes will be made as soon as possible. If a class is cancelled for reasons other than inclement weather, staff will attempt to notify parents. Classes cancelled due inclement weather may not be able to be rescheduled nor a refund made.

REFUND POLICY

- 1. Cancellations may occur up to one week before the activity start date. Participant must call or visit the KRD office 920-766-6335 to cancel an enrollment. A \$5 per class per participant cancellation fee will be charged with the balance of the fee being refunded. Cancellations may also be applied as credit on account. We do not refund in cash. Credit will remain on account for two years after the issue date.
- 2.A full refund will be credited or issued to the participant if a program, date, or time change is changed by KRD and the participant is unable to participate due to that change.
- 3. Full refunds will be issued 1-week prior to the registration deadline.
- 4. Refunds will not be issued after a program has started or deadline has been reached.
- 5. A full refund will be issued if the participant becomes ill/injured. A doctor's statement will need to be presented.
- 6. Pool passes will not be refunded.
- 7. Team fees will not be refunded unless another team can take a spot in the league. Refunds will not be issued after schedules have been completed.
- 8. Participants wishing to change/transfer class/day/time-if there is availability may do so with a \$5.00 transfer fee which need to be paid before the transfer can be made.
- 9. Tickets are non-refundable.
- 10. Any miscellaneous refund is at the discretion of the Director.





YOUTH SPORTS

GYMNASTICS LEVELS 1-4

*These levels are designed for coaches to best support your gymnasts!

Placing gymnasts in the appropriate skill level is vital in helping them grow and learn fundamental skills!

There is no age restriction within any of the levels, and
is designed to support gymnasts ages 4-13 (Pre-K-8th Grade).

LEVEL 1 0-1 YEARS EXPERIENCE

This level is ideal for beginners! We build foundational skills, learn about gymnastics as a sport, and get to know our bodies. This level also has an emphasis on learning listening and following directions in the gym. Foundational skills include, but are not limited to: Forward rolls, walking in releve, coupe, posse, and basic jumps and leaps. Two sections of this level are available.

LEVEL 2 2-3 YEARS EXPERIENCE

This level builds on the foundations made in level one. Gymnasts are getting to know their strengths and how to use those to support more challenging areas of practice in order to become well-rounded gymnasts. This level also introduces the idea of taking positive risks and building gymnasts confidence. Skills in this level include, but are not limited to: backbends, handstands, pivot turns, scales, and leaps.

Two sections of this level are available.

LEVEL 3 4-5 YRS. EXPERIENCE

This level is designed for more intermediate level gymnasts. Gymnasts continue to build their confidence and begin to work more independently on skills. This level is also an introduction to a more team-oriented environment. Gymnasts are growing an attention to detail in their skills that will aid their progression as they advance in difficulty level. Skills in this level include, but are not limited to: cartwheels, round offs, backbend kickovers, jumps on beam, handstands off vault, and forward/backward passes.

Two sections of this level are available.

LEVEL 4 6+ YEARS EXPERIENCE

This is our most advanced level. It is a team oriented-level, designed to challenge gymnasts and prepare them to participate on a high school team or at a competitive level. Gymnasts at this level are able to work independently and understand where it is appropriate to take risks and where to ask for help. Skills in this level include, but are not limited to: aerials, front tucks, front handsprings, cartwheels on beam, and handstands over yault. One section of this level is available.
